COURSE DESCRIPTION

BUSA 6046. **Graduate course in Free Enterprise in Practice II.** A continuation of BUSA 6045, the course is designed to advance students' leadership and managerial skills through analysis and completion of projects, preparation of annual report, and successful completion of Regional and national competition. Graduate Students will assume leadership roles in this course, and will receive assignments based on their areas of experience. Prerequisite: BUSA 6045 (3-0-3)

COURSE OBJECTIVES

Students will be able to:

Review and critically analyze projects initiated in BUSA 6045 in terms of accomplishments of goals and SIFE judging criteria stated in the SIFE handbook.

Take leadership role in preparing the annual report for regional and national competition

Present findings to the School of Business Advisory Council, and other stakeholders

Present annual report in the regional and national competition

Demonstrate leadership ability and the importance of business ethics in free enterprise.

Analyze the role of free enterprise in the world economy.

COURSE REQUIREMENTS

Students will be required to complete projects initiated in BUSA 6045, review judging criteria in the SIFE handbook, prepare annual report, present annual report to stakeholders and in the regional and national competition, and demonstrate leadership ability throughout the course.

EVALUATION
