THEME:

GLOBAL CHANGE, SHIFTING DYNAMICS, AND THE THIRD WORLD

Scope: The year 2011 has thus far been marked by dramatic dynamics that merit academic attention. As the global North continues to experience economic fluctuations and persistent problems associated with shrinking economies and instability of currencies, the global South, too, has been embroiled in change. How this change impacts individuals in disparate locations remains to be seen. However, events such as those related to governance and popular uprisings in Northern Africa and the Middle East are clearly shaping the political terrain in ways that will have repercussions for years to come. Global change presents challenges to our ways of thinking about the Third World, and it also presents opportunities—both for academic work and for social movements. How we conceptualize of these transitions and their significance will need to be worked out amongst a wide range of individuals from a variety of disciplines who bring to the table a range of perspectives. In light of this, the 29th Annual Meeting of the Association of Third World Studies is designed to provide a forum for some of these conversations to take place.

The location for the 29th Annual Meeting of ATWS in Salvador da Bahia, Brazil, is intended to highlight the importance of scholarship related to shifting global dynamics and the global South. Papers and panels from all academic disciplines that deal with Africa, Asia (except those with an exclusive focus on Japan), Latin America, the Caribbean, the Middle East, and North/South dynamics are welcomed.
