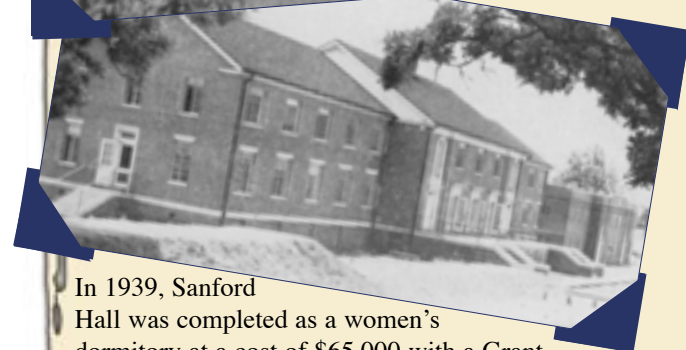

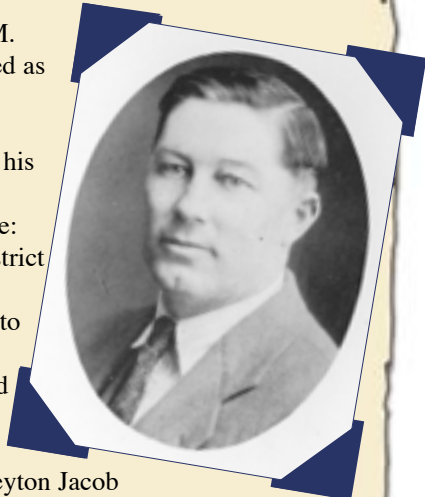


Morgan Hall was completed in 1936 as a men's dormitory at a cost of \$69,300, which was financed through a loan from the Public Works Administration. It was named in honor of Regent S.H. Morgan who outlined the campus front drive, Morgan Hall being an integral part. It was renovated in 1995.

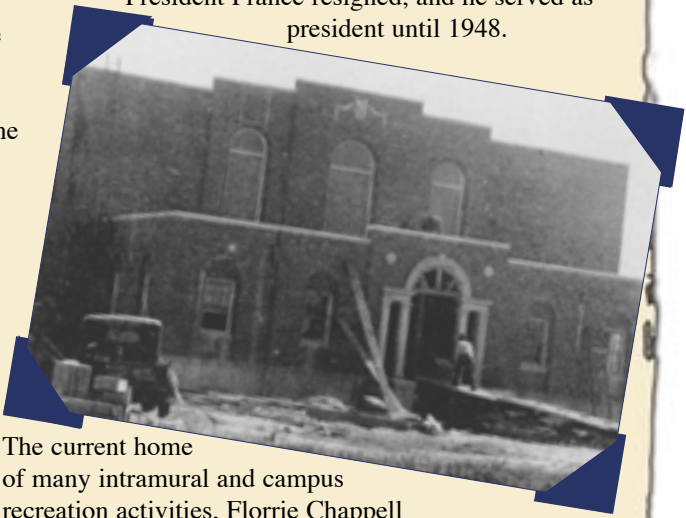


In 1939, Sanford Hall was completed as a women's dormitory at a cost of \$65,000 with a Grant from the PWA. This building was named in honor of Grace McClathy Sanford who was the wife of Stedman Vincent Sanford, Chancellor of the University System of Georgia, 1935-1945. A complete renovation of Sanford Hall was done in 1999 at a cost of \$1 million.

Presidents—John M. Prance (right) served as president of this institution from 1921-1934. During his tenure, the school's name changed twice: from The Third District Agricultural and Mechanical school to Americus Normal College in 1926 and to Georgia Southwestern College in 1932. Peyton Jacob took over as President of GSW in 1934, when President Prance resigned, and he served as president until 1948.



Carters—Mrs. Rosalynn Smith Carter graduated from GSW in 1946, and President Jimmy Carter attended in 1942. Following his stay at GSW, President Carter attended the U.S. Naval Academy in Annapolis, Maryland. Both President and Mrs. Carter hold honorary doctorates from GSW.



The current home of many intramural and campus recreation activities, Florrie Chappell Gymnasium/Auditorium, was also built in 1939 by the Board of Regents and PWA at a cost of \$65,000. The main floor served as a combined auditorium (seated 1,000) and basketball court with a swimming pool facility in the basement. It was named in honor of Florrie Allen Chappell, mother of Allen Chappell, former Georgia senator and member of the Georgia Public Service Commission during Peyton Jacob's administration.
